# Results from the 2007 Rotary Livestock Auction

More than \$200,000 went to 4-H and FFA livestock exhibitors at the 2007 Tulelake Rotary Club's Junior Livestock Auction at the Tulelake Butte Valley Fair.

Numerous business and individuals paid well over market prices for animals, while many contributed toward a pool that boosted the price for all exhibitors. Butte Valley FFA donated a project to raise funds for their chapter activities throughout the year.

Michelle Rupert's Grand Champion lamb was purchased by Jocks Supermarket for \$22/pound. Geovany Salazar's Reserve Champion lamb was purchased by South Valley Bank & Trust along with Pelican Tractor for \$18/pound.

Zane Burrier had the Grand Champion Beef that was purchased by Pape' Machinery Rental for \$5/pound. Ethan Herman's Reserve Champion Beef was purchased by Lassen Canyon Nursery for \$4.50/pound.

Last year Taylor Broomell had our Grand Champion Pen of Market Rabbits purchased by South Valley Bank & Trust & Pelican Tractor for \$51/pound.

Sawyer Fensler's Grand Champion hog was purchased by Sterling Bank for \$9/pound. While Logan Herman's Reserve Champion hog sold to Lassen Canyon Nursery for \$5/pound.

The average price per pound was \$10.96 for Sheep, \$3.21 for Beef, and \$5.20 for Swine. A Total of 25 sheep, 16 beef, 1 rabbit, & 72 swine were sold at last year's auction not counting scholarship and special projects.
